
AWARD WINNING SERVICE USER!

HAPPY BIRTHDAY DAVE




NEW TRUSTEES




The DPSS team met up for a Hat Day at the White Lion in Leominster to write their operational plan for the coming year.

Hat Day, is a way of getting individuals to focus on particular aspects of ideas or projects.


The team thoroughly enjoyed being able to work together on the plan and have some great new initiatives which will hopefully help grow the service. They also enjoyed a lovely lunch!





Ian Bambrough took advantage of the Spring sunshine and gave fellow Service User Sheila Carr's lawn a first cut.

He did a brilliant job and both Sheila and Ian were really chuffed with it.






FAIR TIME FUN





PREPPING FOR THE PICNIC






SUMMER FUN






JULY






OUT AND ABOUT





Neil also met up with friend and fellow Service User John Prior for a long overdue catch up this month and a few games of pool. Looks like a great day with lots of fun and laughter



FAREWELL MAGGIE

It was with great sadness this year that SIL said a final goodbye to Maggie O'Neill who sadly passed away in August.

Maggie was one of the small group of people in Herefordshire who in 1996, campaigned for the right to have a direct payment. The group were successful in their campaign and as a result the Herefordshire Centre for Independent Living was formed, which later changed its name to Services for Independent Living.

By this time the organisation had become a registered charity and was not only supporting people to employ their own personal assistants, but also providing supported living in people's own homes.

Maggie went on to become a trustee, a role she held for many years, including two years as Chairperson of the Board, before stepping down earlier in 2022.

In July, to mark her outstanding contribution to SIL, and to thank her for all her hard work over more than a quarter of a century, SIL awarded Maggie the position of Honorary President. This was the first time SIL ever created this role. Maggie was a great friend to all our service users and staff and she is sadly missed.
