The Building Better Opportunities (BBO) programme helps those furthest away





The project is funded by The National Lottery Community Fund and the European Social Fund

from employment gain the skills and experience they need to get into work. Jointly funded by the European Social Fund and the National Lottery Community Fund it tackles the root causes of poverty, promotes social inclusion, and drives local jobs and growth.

BBO Herefordshire works with people 19+ years across the county who are experiencing multiple barriers, resulting in social exclusion. The project helps participants gain skills and develop confidence through intensive personalised support to equip them with the abilities needed to move towards and into employment. It also provides access to a wide and diverse range of volunteering opportunities, enabling more disadvantaged people to move into further education or training having acquired basic skills, increased confidence and motivation through participation in project activities.

And if you run out of work in your own garden, why not help a friend! This is what service user Ian did and has been busy helping fellow service user, Sheila with her garden.


In theory this was to help with her lawn, but Alexa provided such fun games and the pair giggled so much that little gardening was done on this occasion!
